The same but different ...

Same but different' is a term often associated with evolution and natural selection. In evolutionary terms the differences that are most useful persist and are maintained through future generations. The *difference* for the coming year with TSN is that we are introducing an annual membership fee for all our members. As with evolution, we believe this change is indeed essential for TSN to survive. We discussed this change at length with our Steering Group and over the last few months have canvassed the thoughts and opinions of the many Kit Club users who have been collecting/returning kits.

So, as a new academic year falls upon us, TSN is writing to all members announcing this new way of working. For the first time in our nearly 20 year history we will be charging a membership fee for all our members. That is however, the only change. The *same* high-quality service that we have offered all schools will continue, all geared towards enhancing your abilities to make school science more engaging and providing links to real-science:

- the availability of science partnerships
- access to >100 high-quality kits
- occasional events and cpd
- newsletters and email updates
- telephone and face-to-face support



TSN partnerships will continue but they cannot be part of the membership offer as they cannot be guaranteed. They will still be offered to members according to demand and arranged to match the needs of the individuals. However, without basic membership of TSN, you will not be offered a scientist partner.

TSN has built a large community over the years. We really hope that many, if not ALL of YOU, will actively support this transition to social enterprise. Even this change *will not guarantee* TSN's long-term future, to do that we would have had to double our maximum rate for all. However, we WANT to continue to
